What lies beneath our feet? Secrets, patterns, connections, tracks, as Robert Macfarlane writes.

The map of relationships between human beings and nature becomes complex undergound yet also clearer, helping us to emerge more knowledgeable from the subterranean world.

Stimulated by observations from landscape architecture, ecology, the natural sciences, environmental art, anthropology and the constantly evolving study area of *environmental humanities*, the intention is to reflect on the option of shifting our gaze over the landscape from the surface

to its very depth. And in so doing, offer a more complex and interconnected picture of life on Earth, made up of intricate, invisible and underground relationships that naturally also involve *Homo sapiens* without considering the latter as a supreme, dominant species. A change of direction that invites us, once again, to reflect on the need to extend the framework of the investigations and development tools that allow us to understand the contemporary sense of landscape, in both its theoretical and operational aspects.
